Presenter: My guest today is Ray Bradbury, the world-known 20th-century American writer, the author of the famous novel "Fahrenheit 451" and a short-story collection "The Martian Chronicles". In a variety of styles - from fantasy and mystery to science fiction and realistic fiction, he touched upon the most urgent issues of the humanity. Today we are going to discuss the similarities and differences in the scientific trends of the 20th and 21st centuries. Mr. Bradbury, are you looking at today's developments in science with hope or with fear?

Bradbury: Well, in spite of writing fiction, I have always had a realistic view of events, just trying to imagine the way they are going to develop. It just looks like things are always going from bad to worse (I heard about Murphy's Law which states: "If anything can go wrong, it will") I disagree with that. Scientific developments have always been carefully monitored by the world community. And it should be this way in the future!

Presenter: To be more precise, in your view, which of the scenarios depicted in your books have come true?

Bradbury: Frankly, I am happy to admit that some of my predictions have turned out to be pretty close to reality. For example, you, guys, do have "talking TV walls" with non-stop reality shows at your homes - I had that in "Fahrenheit 451". You are also even more aware of the environment than my character of "The Green Morning" in my "The Martian Chronicles". And you are searching to employ the latest technological developments to find solutions to environmental issues. Also, the topic of the Robotics and AI are no more science fiction for you these days. I am glad to see your success in the field of creating Artificial intelligence. As you know, I depicted a highly automated house in my story "There Will Come Soft Rains", and now I know that a "Wife-Home" is available

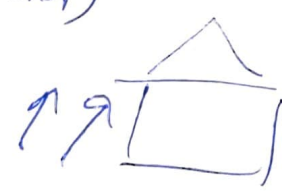

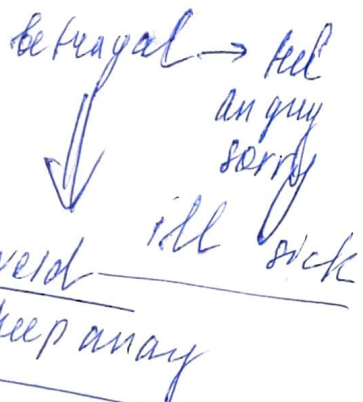
