AN INTERVIEW WITH AGATHA CHRISTIE

Interviewer: Without doubt, the person sitting next to me needs no introduction. She is the world's renowned writer of the 20th century, the author of such literary masterpieces as DEATH ON THE NILE, HICKORY DICKORY DOCK, THE MURDER ON THE ORIENT EXPRESS and many others. Being extremely successful in writing detective novels, this British author is often referred to as THE QUEEN OF CRIME. Agatha Christie, good evening and thank you for sharing your precious time to discuss current trends in science.
