For example, they might not like the story telling part, as they ^{starting} have probably read the Greek myths in school already. On the other hand, bed time at midnight would make younger children exhausted. Most of the kids their age go to sleep at 8 or 9 p.m., so staying up late could be hard for them. That's why I think that it's not suitable for these age limits.

If we ~~look at the activities closer~~ ^{look at the activities closer} to the age, then I have almost no problems with the organization of the event. Kids usually need 8-10 hours of sleep daily, but ~~also~~ ^{also} this sleepover they will get only 7. More than that, the film 1300 Spartans is definitely not for young audience. Snack break at 9 p.m. is not good for ~~health~~ ^{health}, too, as the doctors ^{metabolism} say that you shouldn't eat anything heavy with calories for 4 hours before the bedtime, but overall the sleepover is not that bad.

I would like to present my own museum event. It is held in the Azov Museum, which is one of the most famous paleontological museums in Russia.
