Museums of Russia share a whole host of features with the British Museum, among which are unique collections of relics, great numbers of priceless artworks, immersive exhibitions, and highly qualified staff engaged in research projects. ~~Russian museums are not as~~ ~~well equipped as their British counterparts.~~ ~~They also have a long history as a theme of World War II~~ ~~covered by numerous~~ THE MUSEUM NIGHT festival which is held annually across Russia resembles SLEEPOVERS AT THE BRITISH MUSEUM, with the latter organized for those aged 8-15 only and focused mainly on a tailored action-packed program. Whereas Russian variation still allows the visitors to experience museums after dark, it does not offer the same variety of amusements, including cooking, crafts, and exclusive shows.

RECOMMENDATIONS

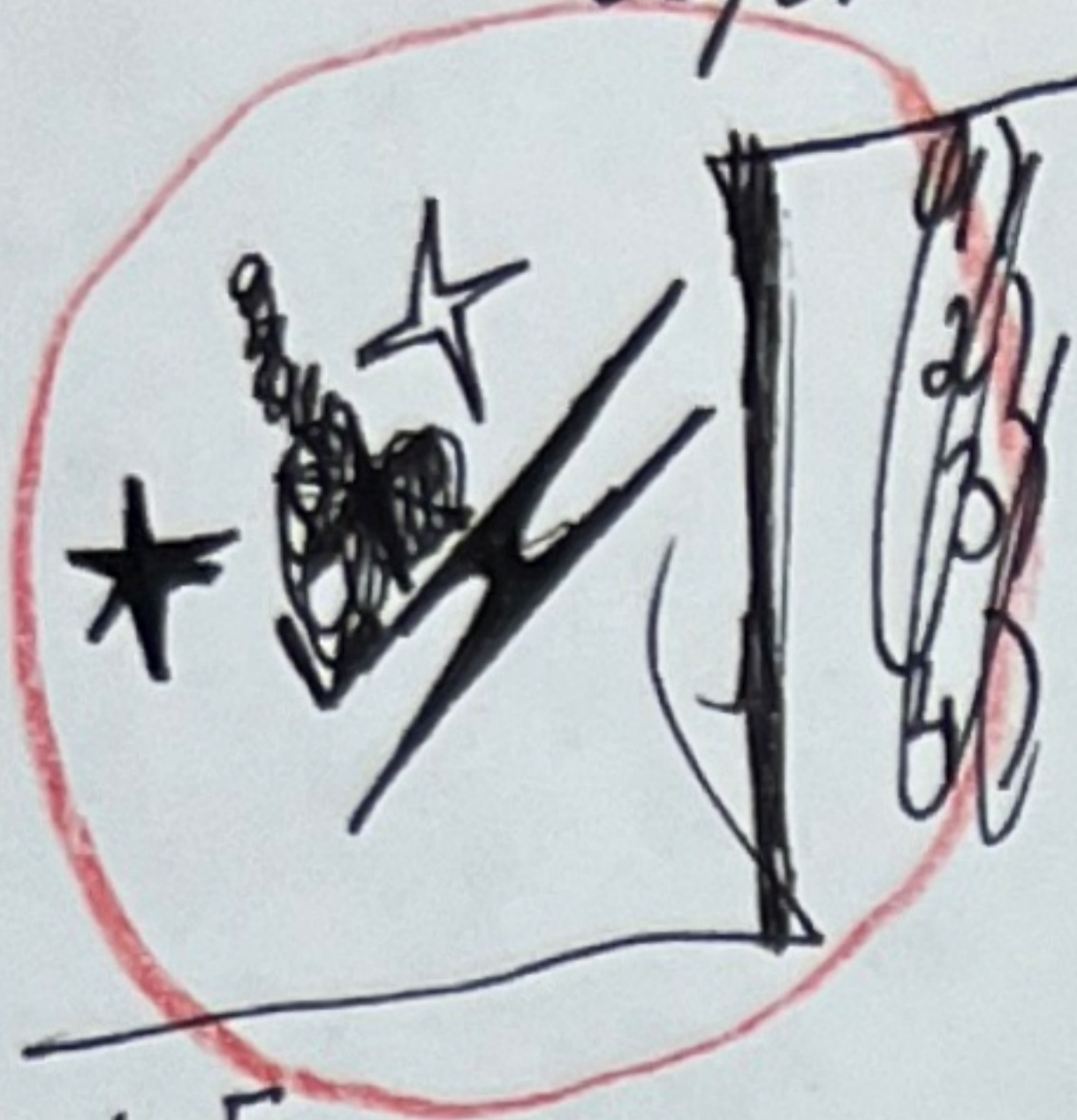
CONCLUSION

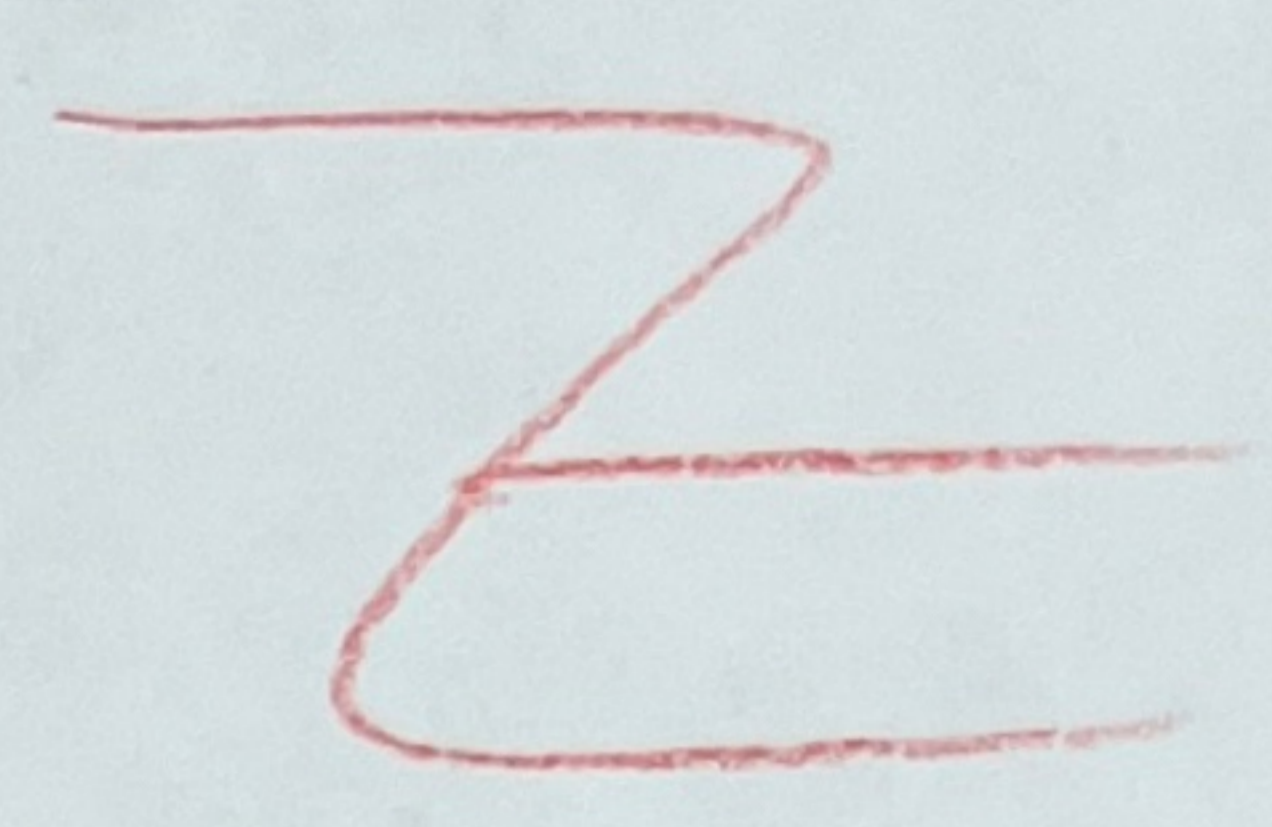
