However, for teenagers aged 16 to 18, such activities in the form of sleepovers, making sketches, etc. might seem slightly confusing and childish, as their mindset bears closer resemblance to that of adults rather than children. As for the organisational aspects of such activities, they are certainly deeply thought through and sensible, since they take into account the usual time when children eat and sleep.

For my part, the excursion that teenagers will ~~undoubtedly~~ get interested in involves the following aged 16 to 18 will undoubtedly get interested in involves the following aspects. First of all, ~~the Moscow State Museum is~~ teenagers of this age are definitely mature enough to appreciate the preciousness and uniqueness of art. With this in mind, organising a visit to ~~the~~ arguably the most iconic gallery in Russia, the Tretyakov Gallery, is a decent and thoughtful option. The ~~to~~ appropriate time for the commencement of the trip is 9:30 am, a time when ~~the~~ traffic is usually low. Upon the arrival to the gallery, teenagers will be met by a guide, who ~~possesses~~ possesses the degree in the history of art and the global history as a whole. Then teenagers ~~or~~ will be given personal headphones ~~in~~ to prevent them from ~~a~~ hearing ~~to~~ distracting or hearing someone else other than the guide. After ~~visiting~~ when observing each work of art, the guide draws attention to certain aspects of an artist's biography and history behind the painting. After observing each hall and deeply analysing its paintings, students are free to ask any questions without hesitation. At ~~12:00~~ 1:00 pm ~~su~~ students are given lunch. The whole excursion is projected to end at ~~16~~ 4:00 pm, when teenagers are given leaflets revising the information ~~previt~~ obtained during a visit.

All in all, despite the seemingly ~~or~~ monotonous nature of the proposed plan for organising a trip, I am convinced that this type of arrangement is nonetheless appropriate for high-school attendants. Therefore, I highly recommend to establish more traditional ways of attending museums for teenagers aged 16 to 18.
