It is aimed at people from the age of sixteen and includes ~~copy~~ recreating a painting ~~with~~ with the ~~the~~ guidance of professionals while looking at the original, listening to surprising and interesting stories about the artists' day to day life and their interactions with each other, and trying to adapt to Leonardo da Vinci's sleeping schedule. The price is 3000 rubles per visitor, it includes ~~at~~ the canvas and oil paint needed for painting. The number of visitors allowed per excursion is thirty. The programme starts at 8 p.m. and lasts through the night until 6 a.m. sharp. It starts with two hours of listening to the guides talk about the artists, after that there's an hour of free time, and then the visitors can choose any painting of Gerasimov, Vrubel or Aivazovsky to reproduce while implementing the sleeping method of the great da Vinci, which means sleeping for twenty minutes every few hours to gain the energy to continue work. The visitors can eat their own food or the snacks that the gallery provides during the event.




