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## Блок 2. Reading.

A. Both extracts have unconventional grammar, which makes reading quite challenging. Despite knowing all of the words, a reader can struggle with grasping the meaning. Extract 3 supports this claim ~~and~~ by David Crystal and shows that grammar matters more than vocabulary. Deciphering misspelled words turns out to be an easier task than trying to understand the content of the poorly written text.

B. Specific grammar brings out specific associations. Substandard grammar of extract 2 may indicate a racial background of the characters, because such ~~syntax~~ style is predominantly used by African-Americans. It might stem from their upbringing in certain areas and closed communities, systematically oppressed and thus lacking education or developing their own grammar systems. Extract 3 hints at a person with a background either completely devoid of education or socialisation, which resulted in such grammar. The reason

behind it might be a disability of some sort, creating obstacles for the character to learn proper grammar. The images created by the second and third extract could be a conversation between black women and a speech or a diary entry by a mentally challenged person.
