For many years he lived with his sister, who kept his house. When she died, he felt lonely and invited the family of his nephew, Mr Henry Dashwood, to live with him. Mr Dashwood was the legal heir of Norland. The old man enjoyed their company, especially the cheerfulness of the children, and grew very fond of the whole family.

Mr Henry Dashwood had one son from his first marriage and three daughters from his second. His son was already well provided for by his mother's fortune, but his daughters had very little money. Their future depended greatly on their father's inheritance.

When the old man died, his will caused disappointment. He left Norland to Mr Dashwood, but only for his lifetime. After him, the estate would belong to his son and then to his grandson, a young child. This meant Mr Dashwood could not sell the estate or use it to help his wife and daughters. The girls received only a small sum of money.

Mr Dashwood did not live long after his uncle. Before his death, he asked his son John Dashwood to take care of his stepmother and sisters. John promised to help them and at first planned to give them money. However, after thinking more carefully, and influenced by his selfish wife, he began to feel that such generosity was unnecessary.

Soon after the funeral, Mrs John Dashwood came to Norland as if it already fully belonged to her. This behaviour deeply upset Mrs Dashwood, who wanted to leave the house. She stayed only because of her daughters.

The amazing story about a boy who never grows up mixes a thrilling plot and some philosophical thoughts so it will be interesting for both young children and adults. The book quickly became a bestseller and is known all around the world now.

The ~~do~~ main hero, Wendy, likes to tell her little brothers stories about Peter Pan. He is a boy who never grows up and lives on a magical island Neverland surrounded by Lost Boys. They play together every day and even joke with the pirates, whose capitan, Hook, hates Peter and looks forward to catching him. One night Wendy wakes up as she hears some voices... and sees the real Pan in her room! The boy tells her that he's lost his shadow, so Wendy helps Peter to find it. Peter offers Wendy to become his 'mum', so she and her brothers set out for a trip to Neverland...

The ~~book is~~ ^{book's} language is really good. Although Barrie ^{has} written it as an adult, you feel like a child is telling the

story. ~~No difficult words or~~ No difficult words or long sentences are hiding under the book's cover - the language is very simple. By the way, it's also harmonic and ~~re~~ pretty organized - it feels like you listen to a melody about believing in miracles. The author's style also lets you understand all the characters and their feelings. ~~Barrie use~~ Sometimes it's like reading Tinkerbell's diary where all her hate to Wendy ~~hides~~ ^{hides} or listening to the author's own thoughts on growing up.

Even though the plot and language are simple and the book is mainly for children, I believe adults may enjoy it too. The main ~~problem~~ ^{topic} mentioning is, of course, growing up. ~~Barrie lets us see that very often children aren't allowed~~ Barrie lets us see that many people stop dreaming when they become adults and forget how full of believing in miracles ~~and they were~~ before. Also, they don't understand their own children who dream of flying and ~~want~~ ^{be friends with} ~~meeting~~ mermaids. This misunderstanding comes between ~~parents~~ ^{a parent} and a child like a wall and doesn't allow them to get on well sometimes. Just like Mr Darling once said Wendy could never speak about Peter Pan again, many adults nowadays force children, who are really creative, ^{to} become "more realistic". The story is like the author's cry - "Remember how imaginative were you as children! Start dreaming again and don't let anything kill your soul's belief in miracles!!". Barrie lets one to ~~think~~ think of reorganising their life ~~by~~ ^{by} making it childishly brighter. I believe "Peter Pan" is really a message to all serious people to take it easy and dream of their own Neverland like they are tiny children.
